61	1-4, 13-15	<b>superintendent</b> 1963, responsible for 10-20 jobs

87	12-19	jt compound labeled asb free in mid 70's so assumed had been ACP prior
90	10-21	Jackson head of Bladenburg 1961-75
91	1-15	he was <b>directly answerable to Jackson</b>
97	12-19	1961-75 in Bladenburg- covered DC jobs
99	11-21	<b>Jackson never told them anything specific about asb hazards</b> - only don't use it, <b>Jackson never mentioned IJS</b>
700	1-12, 18-21	Hamp member of IAWCC 1961-75 Walls & Ceilings mag available to everyone in office, <b>5/70 edition</b>
701	1-9	never given him by Jackson
702	13-15, 17-21	no one other than Jackson discussed with him
703	1-10	after notice told Yees would not use anymore, did not <b>tell Yees to be medically checked</b> for ARD
711	1-21	in charge of dry wall dept - used ready mix jt compound, spackle, dry spackle mixed with water



712	1, 13-20	<b>sanding of spackle /jt compound caused dust</b>
713	8-18, 20	foreman of those sanding - he saw the dust he was exposed to ACP
714	3-19	jt compound were ACP 1961-75 including GP
718	14-21	member of IAWCC since he was there
719	1-19	Hamp to meetings, told Yees what discussed re asb., Hamp was founding member of group
720	4-5	absolutely attended meetings
747	2-8, 13-14, 17-19	Hamp not responsible for ventilation
748	3-9, 15-21	up to general, <b>Hamp responsible to make sure people in area where dust was diffused wore protective devices</b>
749	1-5, 9-11	fireproof sprayers got resp, plasterers got no mask
